#### **Update on Civida Housing Site on 41 Ave**

As many members have noticed, the Civida housing site along 41 Avenue and 115 Street is vacant and fenced off. An update was provided by Edmonton City Councillor Michael Janz in December 2023.

This site is a City-owned, Civida operated 70-unit community housing complex. Starting in 2021, an investigation identified that major structural issues were present and that the whole site would require redevelopment. In 2022, mitigation work began to address safety hazards and in 2022/23 tenants were relocated to other sites.
